

History of the Go for the Gold Curriculum and Funding

2005: ENLC was awarded a three-year federal abstinence education grant (SPRANS) The Go for the Gold Curriculum was developed under this funding as an additional 3 to 5 day program for juniors and seniors in high school.

2006: The organization was awarded a five-year grant for Marriage Works! Ohio as part of the Healthy Marriage Federal Initiative. (This included providing the extended 9-day Go for the Gold program in high schools.) The first edition of the Go for the Gold student handbook (nine chapters) was published.

2011: ENLC was awarded another large federal Healthy Marriage Initiatives grant, which included Go for the Gold. The three-year grant was extended for a fourth year.

November 2011: ENLC was awarded Title V funding through the State of Ohio's Adolescent Health Center grant which has been renewed every two years since.

2016, **2019**, **2023**: Three 3-year federal Sexual Risk-Avoidance Education grants to provide healthy relationship education (Go for the Gold) to students were awarded to ENLC.
